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STAFF COMMITTMENT STATEMENT

We believe that the camp experience is transformational for all ages. Serving hundreds of thousands of kids, the Y offers a variety of programs from Preschool and School-Age to Teen and Overnight camps. Camps give kids the chance to make new friends, learn new skills and engage in indoor and outdoor adventures. We utilize the YMCA core values to teach campers how to be more independent and contribute to a group through physical, social and educational activities.

PAYMENT & REGISTRATION

All camp registration is done online. If you do not already have a YMCA online account, we recommend getting one set up before camp registration opens. Camp Registration for YMCA Members opens on February 14. Registration for Non-Members is February 28.

A non-refundable & non-transferable deposit of \$25 is required for each week your camper plans to attend. This deposit will be deducted from the overall weekly fee.

Full camp payment is due on the 15th of the month prior to the month of camp. For example, if your camper is signed up for camp(s) in June, full payment for all June camps is due May 15.

CAMP FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

You can apply for financial assistance before camp registration begins. Financial assistance is available through Connecting Kids or the Mankato Family YMCA.

SUMMER FOOD PROGRAM:

Due to construction beginning, Mankato West High School will be unable to assist with providing lunch for the Mankato Family YMCA summer camp program this year. Additionally, we unfortunately do not have the resources to provide transportation to other schools. As a result, we kindly ask that all campers bring a packed cold lunch each day for summer 2025. Thank you for your understanding and support!



CHECK-IN/CHECK-OUT:

The safety and of all children is our #1 priority. Each child must be signed in and out every day by a YMCA staff. Only authorized individuals will be allowed to pick up a child. Check In is between 7:30am-8:30am. Check Out occurs from 4:30-5:30pm.



LATE ARRIVAL/EARLY PICK-UP:

If campers are arriving late to the YMCA (after 8:30am) and the camp in which the camper is registered for has already departed, it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to get their camper to the location of the camp. If a camper needs to be picked up prior to end of day (before 4:30pm), it is the responsibility of the parent/guardian to meet the camper at the location in which their camp resides.



WHAT TO BRING TO CAMP:

Backpacks are strongly encouraged to come to camp every day. Bring a refillable water bottle, sunscreen and bug repellent every day. Sunscreen* should be applied before arriving at Camp; staff are not permitted to apply sunscreen to campers but they will remind campers to apply it often! Bring swimsuit and towel on swim days! Label everything! *Sunscreen is not provided.



FIELD TRIPS:

A unique field trip is built within your camp experience. Lunch is not provided on field trip days. Please note: field trips are subject to change.



CAMP T-SHIRTS:

Camp t-shirts must be worn on field trip days! The camp fee includes one t-shirt, which is distributed the first week of camp that your child(ren) attend. Additional shirts can be purchased for \$10 through our Director of Youth Development.



WHAT TO WEAR:

Campers should dress comfortably for the weather and must wear closed-toe shoes. Flip-flops/sandals/crocs are only permitted on the pool deck. Label everything, especially your child's camp t-shirt!



PARENT HANDBOOK:

Extended policies are included in our Summer Camp Handbook, which can be found online or at the Front Desk.



DEPOSITS AND FEES:

A \$25 non-refundable & non-transferable deposit per session is required to save your spot. Deposit is applied to the final balance.



PAYMENTS:

Payments must be received by the 15th of the month prior. Example: June camps are due May 15th. If payment is not received, your child will be dropped from the camp program and deposit will be forfeited. Payments will be set up on a draft and can be scheduled online through your account.



WHAT IS NOT ALLOWED AT CAMP:

Personal electronics (including smart watches, cell phones & tablets), toys or games from home, shoes with wheels and weapons of any kind are not permitted at camp. Large sums of money, jewlery, or anything else of value should not be brought to camp. The Y is not responsible for lost, stolen or damaged personal items.



REFUNDS & DROP POLICY:

No refunds or credit will be issued for any days not attended. Those who wish to withdraw their registration for a camp must do so no later than **two (2) full weeks** before the camp is scheduled to start. The initial \$25 deposit used to register for a camp session is non-refundable & non-transferable. No refunds will be given after the **two (2) week** policy prior to the start of camp. If you are registered for a program and you cancel your membership, you will be billed for the non-member rate of the program.

BEHAVIOR MANAGEMENT:

The following behaviors are inappropriate and may results in suspension or dismissal. Behavior that directly or indirectly threatens the safety of participants, staff, or campers self, behavior that intentionally causes destruction to YMCA property, behavior that results in a consistent disruption to the YMCA Summer Camp program, behavior that does not align with the Mankato Family YMCA Core Values.
